Context: This talk will aim to discuss interdisciplinary dimensions, limits and opportunities of SocioHydrology in the context of IAHS/Panta Rhei Initiative (2013-2022; https://iahs.info/ <u>Commissions--W-Groups/Working-Groups/Panta-Rhei.do</u>). With support of CAPES and FAPESP, with associated participation of Brazilian (EESC-USP, UFPE, UFCG, CEMADEN, EMBRAPA, IIE, IAG-USP) and foreign universities of all continents, the CAPES SASW&SC is launched in 2018 leaded by the EESC-USP. Also, SASW&SC has alliance with the National Institute of Science and Technology for Climate Change Phase 2 (www.cemaden.gov.br) and the FAPESP Research Centre for Research Innovation & Communication (CEPID) of Applied Mathematics for Industry (CeMEAI; www.cemeai.icmc.usp.br), and the Interdisciplinary Centre for Investigation of Climate (INCLINE, www.incline.iag.usp.br). Short Bio: Blöschl is a foreign member of the Academy of Sciences of the Institute of Bologna (2017). He received the Robert E. Horton Medal from the American Geophysical Union (AGU) in 2015, became a Corresponding Member of the Austrian Academy of Sciences (ÖAW) in 2014, received the Helmholtz International Fellow Award of the Helmholtz Association, Germany in 2014, and the International Hydrology Prize from the IAHS in 2013. He was named Boussinesq Lecturer of the Royal Academy of Sciences, the Netherlands in 2013. He also is an ERC Advanced Grant Laureate, and was named Leonardo Lecturer: EGU in 2011. He received the Creativity Prize of the Prince Sultan Bin Abdulaziz International Prize for Water in 2018 and the John Dalton Medal from the European Geophysical Union in 2019. Blöschl is a member of the German Academy of Science and Engineering (Acatech) (2010), and has been a fellow of the American Geophysical Union (AGU) since 2006, and the International Water Academy, Norway since 2003.
